### Craft

Print out the stencil at the end of this document for your child to colour in and decorate. If you don't have a printer use blank paper and cut out a palm or leaf shape.

Help your child to decorate their palm. You may like to collect a few leaves from your garden to look at. You can even use these leaves to stick onto the palm, or if you have green paper you can cut out pieces to stick on like a collage depending on the age of your children.

Repeat the above process with the cloak outline. Your children can decorate these using bright colours and patterns.

Cut out the outlines of both the palms and cloaks. These will be used in our story time.

# **Story Time**

Today's Bible story is of Palm Sunday when Jesus comes to Jerusalem as a King. Find this story in your child's Bible to show them some pictures.

Please be creative with how you fill all the characters of the story. You may choose to use your children's soft toys of a donkey with a doll riding on it. You can even choose to allow your child to be Jesus on your back while you are the donkey.

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It was about time for Jesus to come to a big city called Jerusalem. He asked his followers to go ahead of him to find a donkey for him to ride. Jesus' followers (some dolls, soft teddy's, you or children) go and find the donkey and bring it back to Jesus.

Jesus got on the back of the donkey. Act this out with chosen characters.

The people were really happy to see Jesus, they knew He was coming to save them. They were so excited they laid their clothes down on the road and some big branches of leaves. They were treating Jesus like a king! Lay the cut outs from your craft time in front of the donkey. If your child is not playing a part in the story they can wave their palm leave and cheer for Jesus.

Most people were really happy to see Jesus but some people didn't like Jesus. They were cross with Jesus.

Encourage your children to show you their best cross face.

The story doesn't finish here Jesus has more to do and the cross people get even more cross, but we will have to come back on Thursday for the next part of the story.
